From The History of US Electronic Warfare

On leaving Division 15, several of its principal members returned to their previous organizations. Fred Terman resumed his work at Stanford University, and Guy Suits went back to General Electric where he became Director of Research. John Christensen and several of the original members of the research team went back to CBS. By mid-1946, the only remaining collaboration of the once huge Division 15 organization working on electronic warfare, was the team of ex-RRL members under Dr. Joe Pettit at the Airborne Instruments Laboratory preparing the APR-9 microwave intercept receiver for production. Joe Kearney became project engineer for the new receiver and later commented:

"When the engineering prototype was ready, I flew on the first airborne tests with it in a PB4Y-2 Privateer from Patuxent River. Once it was ready to go into production, we handed it over to the Aircraft Radio Corporation and to Collins, and they turned it out in large numbers. (In later years the APR-9 would be built by several other companies such as Loral, Bendix, etc.) The APR-9 was tremendously successful, and was to last far longer than any of us had expected. Designed originally as the receiver part of the Elephant shipboard jammer, it had been developed to a Navy requirement for an airborne ELINT receiver, and was also bought for the US Air Force. Then it went through the full circle, when the Navy ordered it as the WLR-1 ELINT receiver for its ships and submarines (it was also used in large numbers by the Army). The APR-17 which came next, was nothing more than an improved APR-9."1
